DESCRIPTION

The tachometers developed by Socitec are alternate tachometric generators without brushes giving the velocity measurement of the wheels of aircraft for the control of braking. These devices are, in their principle, of the unipolar permanent magnet alternators delivering a sinusoidal signal, whose frequency is proportional to the speed of drive. They are designed to function in harsh environment.

The electric signal resulting from the coil is provided on the output connector. For matter of redundancy, some tachometers can have 2 coils providing 2 independent and electrically insulated signals.

There are three ranges of tachometers according to their sizes: \varnothing 30, \varnothing 45, \varnothing 80.





ST30 and ST45 These two lines of product include two models, one simple and the second with a double magnetic circuit. The ST45 equips in particular the RAFALE whereas the ST30 equips the FALCON 2000.

ST80 This line of product includes two models, of which one with reduced couple. It equips the AIRBUS range A300, A310, A319, A320, A321, A330 and A340. All these aircrafts, in daily exploitation in more than 100 airline companies, have a brake system equipped with our tachometers. More than 25 000 items are currently in service.
